**OUR KEY PROGRAM INTERVENTIONS**

**MENTAL, NEUROLOGICAL AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS (MNS) - INTERVENTIONS**

- MHPSS awareness raising (Psychoeducation, radio talk shows)
- Community-based socio-therapy
- Mental health outreaches
- Building the capacity of MHPSS service providers
- Individual therapy (psychological first aid)
- Group therapy through Cognitive Behavioral
- Therapy and Problem Management Plus
- Home-based care and family home visits

**CHILD CARE AND PROTECTION - INTERVENTIONS**

- Training duty bearers and actors in child protection concepts,
- prevention and responses mechanism.
- Life skills training sessions for children.
- Positive parenting skills sessions.
- Sensitization campaigns in communities.
- Child protection case management including referrals.
- National level engagements with key stakeholders like the National Child Protection Working Group.
- Creating child-friendly environments and safe spaces.

**GBV PREVENTION AND MITIGATION -INTERVENTIONS**

- Continuous support, collaboration and data-driven guidance provided to the partners.
- Placing case workers at high-volume health facilities, capacity building of parasocial workers and coaching and mentorship of community structures to deliver quality services.
- Trained community support structures continued to deliver services through different methodologies like SASA Awareness, Support and Action (SASA) to improve services
- Creating child-friendly environments and safe spaces.

**HIV/AIDS PREVENTION, CARE AND SUPPORT - INTERVENTIONS**

- Case management, systems strengthening and child protection, working with medical partners.
- Targeting specific subgroups e.g. children of female sex workers, HIV-exposed infants and adolescents living with HIV.
- Graduating households from vulnerability.
- Violence prevention curriculums (No Means No).
- HIV testing services and disclosure support.

- Nutrition education assessment and referral.
- Treatment literacy and emergency food and transport.
- TB screening and referral.
- Income growth support (cottage skills and saving groups)
- GBV screening and response.

**DISASTER RISK PREVENTION AND RESPONSE - INTERVENTIONS**

- Apprentice training for youth in cottage industry practice.
- Economic strengthening for households to remain resilient.
- Agroecology for farmer groups.
- Good agronomic practices skilling for improved yields.
- Training in climate-smart agriculture and detection of early warning signs of drought, agriculture policies and sustainable land management.
- Support for mechanization of agriculture using tractors and provision of agro-inputs like pesticides, irrigation technologies and improved seed varieties.

**LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT - INTERVENTIONS**

- Supporting the formation of savings groups with financial literacy skilling
- Training in backyard gardening, apprenticeship and life skills for youth out-of-school cottage training, and linkages to other service providers.
- Other case management services offered to households included referral, treatment literacy and adherence increasing access to care and treatment and economically stable households.

**ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY - INTERVENTIONS**

- Organisation development interventions include staff capacity-building trainings, orientations and project reviews. TPO Uganda rolled out its new Strategic Plan 2022-2027, focusing on consolidating the gains. To further actualize the strategy, TPO Uganda developed Standard Operating Procedures, Quality Minimum Standards and the M&E framework. These are being integrated across different thematic areas and regions. In addition, TPO Uganda recruited a full-time Program Manager in charge of quality assurance for project implementation, operational efficiency, resource mobilization and beneficiary satisfaction.
